Historical note:

The Armed Forces Epidemiological Board (AFEB) operated as a research organization from 1941 to 1972. The Board was originally named Board for the Investigation and Control of Influenza and Other Epidemic Diseases in the Army. It was established at the recommendation of Brigadier General James S. Simmons, Chief of Preventive Medicine in the Office of the Surgeon General, with the advice of Colonel Stanhope Bayne-Jones, Dr. Francis G. Blake, Chairman of the Department of Medicine at Yale University School of Medicine, and Dr. Colin M. MacLeod, Professor and Chairman of the Department of Microbiology at the New York University School of Medicine. It was reorganized in 1944 as the Army Epidemiological Board and then into the Armed Forced Epidemiological Board in 1949. Members of the Board were to be civilian advisors to the military. This Board differed from other advisory boards in that its members undertook field work, conducted research and attempted to solve medical problems. Its original mission was to investigate and control influenza and other epidemic diseases in the army. There were seven original Commissions. Over the subsequent years new commissions were created or combined as needed. AFEB was sponsored by the Office of the Surgeon General of the Army. In 1973 it was reorganized again into a strictly advisory board.

Scope and content of the collection:

The AFEB records include correspondence, reports, laboratory data, reprints, unpublished reports, protocols and procedures, memorabilia, AV material, photographs, and slides. The most in depth materials are from the Commission on Epidemic Hemorrhagic Fever, with the years 1952-1954 most heavily represented; and from the Commission on Immunization, the U.S. Army Scrub Typhus Team, the bulk of which comes from the years 1948-1949; both of which were closely associated with Dr. Joseph Smadel.

Custodial History:

The AFEB records from 1941 through 1949 were transferred from Yale University to WRAIR in 1972. These records had been placed at Yale by Dr. Stanhope Bayne-Jones, who had been the Administrator from 1941-1946 and then AEB President from 1946-1947. However, Board members unanimously voted to move the records to WRAIR in 1970. WRAIR was able to accept the records in 1972.

The records from 1953-1992 were donated by Dr. Theodore Woodward in 1995(?). Dr. Woodward was President of the Armed Forces Epidemiological Board from 1976-1978 and again from 1980-1990. The bulk of these records are from his tenure as President. In addition to the paper records, there were 2 photograph albums (Presidents and Members of the Armed Forces Epidemiological Board, and Commission Directors of the Armed Forces Epidemiological Board), 3 framed photographs and an envelope full of photographs. There were also loose photographs in the albums.

The histories of the Commission on Viral Diseases were donated by Theodore Woodward as part of his research for the two histories of the AFEB that he edited in 1990 and 1994.

The 14 photographs from the Commission on Schistosomiasis, Commission on Tropical Diseases were given to COL Myron G. Radke (then Associate Director of WRAIR) by COL Dale Wykoff in 1984. The slides from the Commission on Schistosomiasis, Commission on Tropical Diseases were donated by COL George W. Hunter III in 1984.

The annual reports from the Commission on Immunization for the years 1947-1969 are from WRAIR Division Director Geoffrey Edsall who was also the Director of the Commission from 1952-1963.

Most of the annual reports from the years 1969-1972 are from the Gorgas Memorial Library.

The remainder of the records, mostly from the Commissions on Epidemic Hemorrhagic Fever and Immunization, were found in the WRAIR library archives. Their provenance is unknown.

Processing note: Original order was retained wherever possible. Materials were separated by media type and arranged chronologically. Exact duplicates were removed and discarded. Metal staples, paper clips and metal binders were removed. All records have been rehoused in acid-free folders. All of the photographs and slides have been rehoused in Mylar sleeves and most have been separated into their

own boxes. Detailed lists attached to groups of correspondence, slides, and reports are retained in the administrative archives records; please contact the archivist for more information.

The AFEB records from 1941-1949 are still in their original folders and filing cabinet. The order of the papers in the folders has been reversed, so they are now in chronological order and most staples have been removed. The AFEB records from 1953-1992 (Dr. Woodward's tenure) are also still in their original filing cabinet. Some of the folders have been retained (Dr. Woodward jotted notes on some of them) and some have been replaced with acid-free folders. The photographs have been removed from the albums and envelope and placed in Mylar sleeves in acid-free boxes. The framed photographs are still framed. The albums have been retained although they are empty.

There are five manuscripts about the history of the Neurotropic Virus Disease Commission, later the Virus and Rickettsial Commission, written by John R. Paul. Three manuscripts have been retyped sometime in the past (presumably by Dr. Woodward while he was editing two books on the history of the AFEB). The mold and disintegration of the paper (most photographs have dissolved and only the captions remain) is too bad to allow for the retention of two histories (Addendum to the History of the Neurotropic Virus Diseases Commission (1 January 1946-1 July 1946) and History of the Virus and Rickettsial Commission [1946-54] Appendix). Photocopies were made of these two manuscripts.

The majority of the annual reports are housed in the grey filing cabinet, next to the filing cabinets that contain series II and series III, and are indicated with **[FC]**.

Series XII: Commission on Immunization, 1946-1974 and undated

The Commission on Immunization, created in 1947, sponsored many studies of which Joseph E. Smadel's scrub typhus project in Malaysia from 1948-1953 was one. Dr. Joseph Smadel tested the use of Chloramphenicol to treat and prevent scrub typhus in Malaysia. This series includes correspondence, ephemera, reports, laboratory data, financial records, publicity, scripts, and AV materials mostly regarding the scrub typhus project. The bulk of the correspondence is between Commission Director Joseph Smadel and the scrub typhus field researchers in Malaysia: Charles Bailey, Herbert Ley Jr., Cornelius Philip, Robert Traub; the Institute of Medical Research Director Raymond Lewthwaite; and the acting director for the Division of Virus and Rickettsial Diseases at the Army Medical Department Research and Graduate School Ross Gauld. The annual reports for the years 1947-1969 are from Geoffrey Edsall who was the Director of the Commission from 1952-1963. The final report was written in 1974 by the Commission's last director Abram Benenson. The publicity folders include press releases and newspaper clippings. This series includes the Institute of Medical Research's Medical Circulars nos. 8, 19, 23, 27, and 29. The SoundScriber recordings are not transcribed. The series is arranged in alphabetical and then chronological order.

Series XVI: Commission on Tropical Diseases, 1945, 1968

The Commission on Tropical Diseases, created in 1941, sponsored many studies over the years of which the Commission on Schistosomiasis was one. The Commission on Schistosomiasis conducted its studies in the Philippines from April through December of 1945. Dr. Ernest Carroll Faust was the Director of the Commission. He was accompanied by Drs. Willard H. Wright, and Donald B. McMullen, MAJ George W. Hunter III and SGTs Preston M. Bauman and James W. Ingalls. During their time in the Philippines the doctors made side trips to Japan and Borneo. This series includes 14 photographs taken by Dr. D.B. McMullen in the Philippines and Japan in 1945. There are also 142 slides of the Commission on Schistosomiasis in the Philippines taken in 1945, 66 are in glass cases and 64 are in cardboard sleeves; in addition there are 11 slides from COL George W. Hunter III's return visit to the Davao Penal Colony in 1968. This series also has 3 negatives of Mindoro maps and a chart. [Photo box 2]
