### Historical note:

The Migratory Animal Pathological Survey (MAPS) was conceived by Lieutenant Colonel Charles M. Barnes in 1963. Its initial objectives were to learn the migration routes of animals in East Asia and the ectoparasites that were harboured by the animals. The study then settled on birds and bats. Lt Col Barnes was its first director. He left the group in 1966 and the study was taken over by H. Elliott McClure, who had been the group's original ornithologist and ecologist. Field research continued until 1970. MAPS was funded by the U.S. Army Medical Service.

### Scope and content of the collection:

The MAPS records include correspondence, three scrapbooks, and six reports.

Processing note: Original order was retained when possible. Materials were separated by document type and arranged chronologically. The scrapbooks are in their original albums. Some correspondence directly and solely related to MAPS came from correspondence files for USAMRU-Malaysia and SEATO-Bangkok; otherwise the correspondence had been filed separately under MAPS. Letters with references to MAPS may still be found in the Records of USAMRU-Malaysia and the Records of SMRL-Thailand.

**Series I: Correspondence, 1963-1973**

This series includes correspondence regarding the establishment of the program and its ongoing issues. Topics include funding, scope of project, personnel, and the location of the MAPS headquarters. The bulk of the correspondence is from Charles Barnes, Charles Cook, H. Elliott McClure, and William D. Tigertt. The correspondence is arranged chronologically.

**Series II: Scrapbooks, undated**

This series includes three scrapbooks documenting work conducted in the various South East Asian nations. The scrapbooks were written in three volumes and their original order has been maintained. The scrapbooks give a brief, but comprehensive overview of the project. The creator is unidentified, but would appear to be H. Elliott McClure. Volumes I and II cover the individual countries/geographic areas with photographs, captions and a brief outline of the work and staff in each. Volume I shows the field research in Korea, Japan, Taiwan, Hong Kong, North Philippines, Palawan, Southern Philippines and Sabah. Volume II shows the field research in Sarawak, Indonesia, Singapore, Malaya, Thailand, India and MAPS headquarters. Volume III covers the conferences from 1964 to 1969.
