### **Historical note:**

The United States Army Medical Research Unit-Panama (USAMRU-Panama) began as a joint effort between the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, National Institutes of Health and the US Army Medical Research and Development Command (USAMRDC), which together formed the Middle America Research Unit (MARU). Work began in 1958 at Balboa Heights, Canal Zone. They were studying infectious diseases in Central and South America. USAMRU-Panama was a Class II activity of the Army Medical Research and Development Command. General Order #90 issued 28 June 1973 by the Office of the Surgeon General of the Army, transferred control of the laboratory to the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research (WRAIR) effective 13 June 1973. The Army continued to work closely with the Gorgas Memorial Institute of Tropical and Preventive Medicine and the Gorgas Memorial Laboratory with the mission of parasitology, biochemistry, and antileishmanial drug development. The Unit was disestablished on 1 July 1976 due to budget constraints.

### **Scope and content of the collection:**

The USAMRU-Panama records include correspondence and reports from 1973, when control was transferred to WRAIR, until its closure in 1976. There is also one report from 1959. CPT Larry Hendricks sent the reprints to WRAIR in 1985.
